Position Summary:

Under the direction of the Fleet Supervisor, the Automotive Technician will conduct automotive maintenance and repairs on all HPS automotive equipment, including vehicles of various makes and

models, small engines, trucks, motorcycles, marine equipment, and any fleet-related assets owned, leased, or rented by the Hamilton Police Service, as required.

Duties include, but not limited to;

- Perform service, diagnostics, and repairs on HPS vehicles and fleet assets (includes electric, hybrid, marine, motorcycles, small engines).
- Conduct vehicle upfitting and decommissioning of police fleet vehicles and equipment, as required.
- Inspect mechanical repairs performed by outsourced service and repair vendors. Notify the Fleet Supervisor of any concerns or issues.
- Order parts and supplies necessary to facilitate vehicle and equipment service and repairs.
- Conduct MVC (motor vehicle collision) inspections and report mechanical conditions on vehicles involved in serious or fatal MVCs.
- Attend court, as required, as an expert witness, in matters relating to MVCs and fatal collisions.
- Inspect vehicles and write Vehicle Safety Certificates.
- Recommend required contractor services and repairs to the Fleet Supervisor for consideration and authorization.
- Submit daily work orders summarizing completed work and parts used.
- Required to attend relevant training courses to remain current, in an ever-changing automotive industry.
- Provide technical input to the Fleet Supervisor, Manager of Fleet & Facilities, and other HPS staff for project requiring technical knowledge.
- Assist in the establishment of both long and short term goals and objectives of Fleet Services.
- Pick up and deliver vehicles, parts, and equipment as directed by the Fleet Supervisor.
- Ensure a safe work environment and report hazards.
- Perform other duties, as assigned, which are related to the major responsibilities of the job, including vehicle upfitting.

Supervisory Responsibilities:

May assume the role and duties of an Acting Supervisor, in the Fleet Supervisor's absence.

Working Conditions:

Standard automotive repair facility currently in the lower level of the Central Police Station; subject to temperature extremes, dirty environment, exposure to the environmental conditions found in typical automotive repair facilities (e.g. vehicle exhaust, gasoline and chemical odours, noisy environment, etc.). May occasionally be required to work away from the shop to conduct automotive repairs, diagnostics, and MVC vehicle inspections.

Physical & Sensory Demands/Dexterity:

Assignments will involve activities such as sitting, standing, walking, lifting, twisting, bending/stooping, reaching, driving, talking, listening, reading, writing, keyboarding, lifting objects greater than 50 pounds and holding objects in awkward positions for extended periods of time.

Education:

Valid Automotive Service Technician (310S) trade certificate recognized by the Ontario College of Trades is required. Truck and Coach Technician (310T) is an asset. Ozone Depletion Prevention (ODP) certification is required.

Experience:

Minimum five (5) years' experience in maintaining automotive vehicles of various makes and models (may include apprenticeship time), an in-depth knowledge of auxiliary lighting, electronics, and electrical systems is essential. Experience with maintaining police fleet vehicles is a definite asset.

Certifications & Licences:

Valid Class G Driver's Licence, or the equivalent, with no more than six (6) accumulated demerit points, permitting you to drive an automobile in Ontario with full driving privileges.

Pleasure Craft Operator Card (PCOC), M-Class Licence, and Working at Heights certification (must be obtained within 24 months of employment).

Skills & Competencies:

- Thorough operational knowledge pertaining to mechanical and electrical systems operation and maintenance.
- Thorough knowledge of all major components of automotive mechanical and electrical systems.
- Knowledge of marine vessels, motorcycles, and small equipment (e.g. generators, compressors, etc.) is an asset.
- Working knowledge of current legislative requirements and practices (e.g. Ministry of Transportation, Ministry of Environment, Occupational Health and Safety Act and its appropriate regulations, WHMIS, etc.).
- Ability to use standard automotive repair equipment (e.g. vehicle diagnostic tools, pneumatic tools, hand tools, floor hoists, cutting torches, welding equipment, etc.).
- Ability to work with electrical schematics, automotive manuals, diagnostic flow charts (both manual and web-based), and troubleshoot systems.
- Ability to perform standard mechanical and electrical tests, diagnostics, and repairs to various automotive systems.
- Skills and abilities to make and carry out recommendations to the Manager of Fleet & Facilities and Fleet Supervisor regarding further development of the automotive fleet maintenance management programs.
- Good verbal and written communication skills, and the ability to relate courteously with the public and members of the Police Service.
- Self-motivation and the ability to work co-operatively with vendors and co-workers.
- Ability to work independently, with minimal supervision.
- Ability to work in environments that are physically challenging (e.g. underneath vehicles, lifting weights over 50 lbs., continuous standing and walking, twisting, reaching, etc.) while tolerating temperature extremes and dirty environments.
