### About HPS

HPS patrols 1.113 square kilometers, serving over 620,063 residents. The Service is divided into two main areas: Operations, which provides visible policing and investigations in various specialized units, and support, which offers services in areas such as Professional Development, Emergency Response, Crime Prevention, Fleet and Facilities, IT, Records and HR. HPS is committed to the highest standards of integrity and professionalism in all its divisions.

Our vision to be a trusted partner in delivering public safety is what motivates our members each and every day. Hamilton Police Service is an innovative police service dedicated to working in partnership with our communities to make Hamilton a safe and healthy community in which to live and work. Established in 1833, Hamilton is one of the oldest policing services in the world.

### What you will be doing?

As part of the Hamilton Police Service Internationally Awarded Auxiliary Unit you will serve, in uniform, at community-based, traffic control, or patrol duties events.

- Assist Paid Duty Officers at Tiger-Cat games, and at McMaster University and Hess Village patrols.
- Assist Sworn Officers on patrol Ride-Alongs and RIDE lanes.

- Assist the Training Branch with Immediate Rapid Deployment and Public Order Unit training.
- Assist Sworn Officers with directing traffic and pedestrians at a wide range of community events.
- Provide station tours, and conduct safety presentations for the community.
- Attend recruiting events and assist with the maintenance of the bike fleet.
- Assist the Mounted Unit with training and participate in marching at ceremonial events.

**Requirements:**

- Possess a valid Class G Driver's Licence, or the equivalent, with no more than six (6) demerit points, permitting you to drive an automobile in Ontario with full driving privileges.
- Be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada.
- Have no criminal convictions for which a pardon has not been granted.
- Have a valid Standard First Aid and CPR certificate (Basic Rescuer level C) before starting in the position.
- Be able to pass a Physical Readiness Evaluation for Police (PREP) test.
- Must be at least 18 years of age.
- Have an email account and internet access.
- Be of good moral character.
- Be mentally and physically capable of performing the duties of an Auxiliary Volunteer.

- Orientation Training Date: May 26<sup>th</sup> or 27<sup>th</sup> from 6:00pm – 9:00pm
- Use of Force Training Week: June 1<sup>st</sup>–4<sup>th</sup> from 8:00am – 6:00pm (must attend all 4 full days)
- Weekly training one (1) evening per week: June 7<sup>th</sup> – July 11<sup>th</sup> from 6:00pm – 9:00pm, excluding Canada Day week. Weeknight to be determined.
