		- I would like to acknowledge and thank the The Hamilton Police Service Victim Services Branch who received a five-year Prostitution Exit Support Services Grant made possible through the Department of Justice Canada Victims Fund. The benefits of this grant will augment the existing work of community initiatives and will enhance education and awareness along with providing direct benefits to individuals. This grant will directly support those who are making choices about their next steps in leaving sex work and it will also provide front line agency workers with some resources to do this. Congratulations!!
		- On February 22, 1986 the Hamilton-Wentworth Regional Police Service absorbed the Harbour Police. Since that date, patrols and policing of Hamilton Harbour have been the responsibility and mandate of the Hamilton Police Service Marine Unit. Today they are not only responsible for the harbour, but all waters within the City of Hamilton as well as portions of western Lake Ontario. The unit trains for and response to approximately 100 calls for service each year which include rescues, vessels in distress, searches, ice rescue and various other incidents mainly concentrated around the Port of Hamilton and nearby marinas.
