Job Location: A variety of locations throughout the City of Hamilton, including personal residences, public places, and police stations.

Hours of work:

- At least four (4) 7.5 or 8.5 hour scheduled on-call shifts per month, including taking turns for weekend and statutory holiday shifts.
- Shift times are: 1630-0000 hours or 0000-0830 hours seven days per week, or 0830-1630 hours on weekends and statutory holidays.
- Attendance is mandatory at professional development training.

Commitment: Minimum one year from the time training ends

Job Summary

Victim Services Direct Service Volunteers will assist the Hamilton Police Service in reaching its Mission and Values to be sensitive to the needs of victims of crime and trauma, and individuals who have survived tragic circumstances.

Volunteers are dispatched to provide service for a variety of circumstances, including, but not limited to, sudden death, suicide, motor vehicle collisions (MVC), domestic violence, sexual assaults, and fire scenes.

General Duties

- Provide emotional support to someone who has been physically hurt, threatened, survived a tragedy, suffered a traumatic loss, or witnessed a traumatic event
- Provide practical assistance to a victim and their family
- Provide referrals to community resources
- Provide information about what to expect and next steps
- Provide professional intervention within the bounds of HPS policies and procedures
- Check Online Message Centre daily and respond accordingly
- Adhere to deadlines for shift registration
- Uphold Hamilton Police Service's Vision, Mission, Values, and Ethics
- Demonstrate adaptability, flexibility, and understanding strategies to address vicarious trauma, as well as empathy, compassion, and excellent communications skills (e.g. active listening)

Rewards

- Gain experience and skills in crisis intervention
- Make a valuable contribution to our community and its members
- Invitation to the Annual HPS Volunteer Appreciation event

<u>Victim Services Direct Service Volunteer applicants MUST:</u>

- Be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada
- Be at least 21 years of age or older
- Live within the City of Hamilton
- Possess a valid Class G Driver's Licence, with no more than six (6) accumulated demerit points, permitting you to drive an automobile in Ontario, and have access to a vehicle
- Have no criminal convictions for which a pardon has not been granted
- Pass a Police Information Check and annual background checks

- Be physically and mentally able to perform the duties of the position (e.g. standing for long periods of time, exposure to victims/witness trauma)
- Have an email account and internet access
- Have a willingness to give back to the community
- Be compassionate and empathetic, care about others well-being, and have excellent problem solving, listening, and communication skills

Orientation/Training:

- Mandatory training from January to April, which teaches volunteers how to handle delicate crime related situations and become familiar with working with victims of crime and/or circumstance via group work and role playing
- safeTALK Suicide Prevention Training
- Volunteer Orientation/Resource Manuals
- Ongoing professional development training and mentorship

There will be a volunteer evaluation and assessment conducted at the end of the training program, as well as an opportunity for volunteers to participate in an "end-of-class" survey following each training session.

- Invitation to Victim Services Training (December)

- Undertaking of Confidentiality Sign-off
- Mandatory attendance at training sessions (January to April)

<u>Terms</u>

- Acceptance into the Victim Services Volunteer Training Program does not guarantee that an applicant will be involved in a direct service intervention to victims
- Volunteers are subject to a six (6) month probationary period after training has been completed

- If selected, volunteers shall not engage in any activity that may result in a criminal record or bring discredit to the Hamilton Police Service or misuse HPS Photo ID
- Volunteers must adhere to direction given at a scene by an Officer or Team Leader, all policies and procedures of the HPS, and the HPS Volunteer Code of Conduct

Applications are to be submitted via the <u>City of Hamilton's Careers</u> website before Monday, October 16, 2017 at 11:59 pm. Applications will be shortlisted throughout the Fall, and those selected for a position will attend training from January to April 2018.

To apply for the position you will need to:

- Have/create a user name and password for the City of Hamilton Careers website
- Upload an application (i.e. cover letter and resume all one document, cover letter first) to the City of Hamilton Careers website
- Complete a questionnaire as part of the online application process
